We are honored to welcome Secretary Salvador Malheiro to the Institute's Global Blue Job Shadow Day.

His Excellency Malheiro led Portugal's delegation to the #UNOC3 in Nice, France in June 2025 with 175 countries and 100,000 people who delivered a unified call to action and strong commitments including The High Seas Treaty officially entered into force on January 17, 2026. This global event emphasized that the Blue Economy decision-making must recognize the connections between human wellbeing, ecosystems and economic sustainability with investments and funding. Secretary Malheiro champions the Blue Economy Ecosystem by advancing the fisheries sector, maritime innovation, and the sustainable growth of Portugal's blue economy – blending scientific expertise, strategic vision, and a deep commitment to the ocean's future.

Born on the island of Vieques, Puerto Rico, Kassandra had few opportunities and little hope for her future. Then when she was 14 years old, she joined the Vieques Youth Leadership Initiative, the Institute's four-year bi-lingual demonstration project to

empower young people to become leaders of their island's future.


For the Institute's Job Shadow Day, Kassandra aspired to become a top model in Puerto Rico – and to use her star power to help other young girls envision their own dreams for their island community. She was matched with the Vice President of L'Oreal Puerto Rico. "I got to spend a whole day with this person that does exactly what I wanted to do, and I get to see what I need to do to make that happen."

Wednesday: Miguel Roque Video

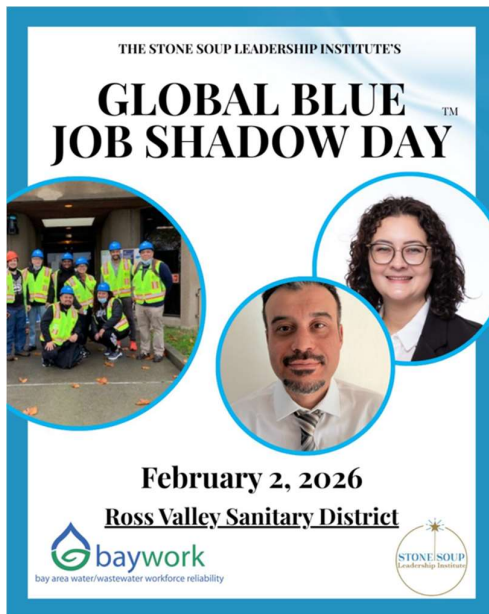

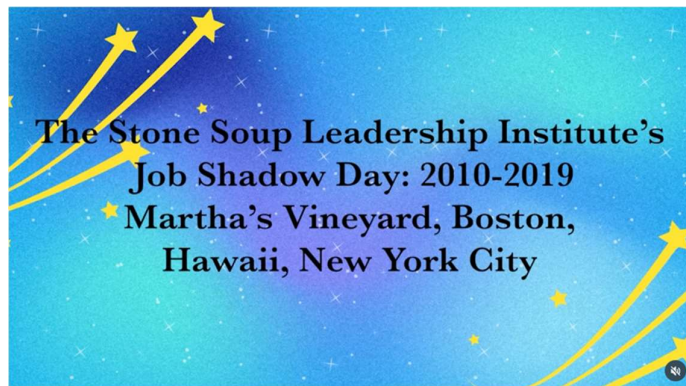

It is the signature event of our programs with communities around the world - from Martha's Vineyard and Boston to Hawaii, Newport Rhode Island, Vieques, Puerto Rico and New York City. First developed with the San Francisco Chamber of Commerce in the early 1990s, the Job Shadow Day has reached

millions of students. In 2021, with the launch of our book, Stone Soup for A Sustainable World: Life-Changing Stories of Young Heroes, the Institute reenvisioned the Job Shadow Day to support the need for Blue & Green workforce development.
